Respect Your Neighbors

Spring is here and everyone wants to enjoy the warmer weather. Please be aware that not everyone enjoys the same type of music. We have two ordinances that deal with this issue and they are the following:

✓ The playing of any radio, stereo, computer or musical instrument or device in such a manner or with such volume, between the hours of 9:00 pm and 7:00 am, so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of any person in any residence, office, dwelling, business, public place, or any person in the vicinity is prohibited.

✓ The use or operation of a loudspeaker or sound amplification device in connection with any radio, tape recorder, stereo, computer, microphone, or other devices in which the emanated sounds are of such a strength, character, intensity, or duration so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of any person in any residence, office, dwelling, business, public place, or any person in the vicinity is prohibited.

Open Burning and Parking Concerns

Please keep the following in mind during Spring cleanup! Village ordinance prohibits open burning, including, but not limited to, leaves, small branches, twigs, trees, paper, grass clippings, rubbish or any other type of vegetable matter.

There are exceptions like burning fuels for legitimate campfires, cooking and recreational purposes, such as barbecues and grills or in domestic fireplaces, in areas where such burning is consistent with other laws. No garbage shall be burned. The exceptions are not to

be abused by calling a burning refuse heap a bonfire. A violation of this ordinance could result in a \$25 fine or higher.

Please Don't Park on Sidewalks

With Spring and Summer here, many people enjoy taking walks. Please do not park your vehicle on or over sidewalks. The Village ordinance prohibits any motor vehicle from standing, stopping or parking on or over a sidewalk. A violation of this ordinance could result in a \$40 fine. The State of Illinois also prohibits this

practice and a state violation could result in a higher fine amount. Remember, parking permission is granted to legally park your vehicle on a Village street. It does not allow you to park your vehicle illegally.

Ditches and Culverts

Please be sure culverts and ditchlines are free of debris to prevent the obstruction of water flow.

Electronic Recycling

Brush Pick Up

The Village picks up tree limbs/debris only after a storm. Please make sure that the butt end of the limb is facing the street – this will make it easier for our crews to pick up. For all other brush pick-up please contact Waste Management at (800) 796-9696 or at www.wm.com.

Free Wood Chips

Wood chips are available for pick-up by Round Lake Beach residents at the Public Works facility (911 Lotus Dive – east side of building).

Healthy Household Habits for Clean Water

Recycle used oil and other automotive fluids at participating service stations. Don't dump these chemicals down the storm drain or dispose of them in your trash.

Use a commercial car wash or wash your car on a lawn or other unpaved surface to minimize the amount of dirty soapy water flowing into the storm drain and eventually into your local waterbody.

Check your car, boat, motorcycle and other machinery and equipment for leaks and spills. Make repairs as soon as possible. Clean up spilled fluids with an absorbent material like kitty litter or sand and don't rinse the spills into a nearby storm drain. Remember to properly dispose of absorbent material.

Summer Maintenance Reminders

In the summertime residents spend more time outdoors. That's why it is important to maintain your property. Grass should be cut regularly and kept weed free.



Garbage cans may be at the front curb/ditch line no more than 24 hours before and/or after scheduled pickup day. They should be kept in the rear of your yard after pickup.

Please do not park your vehicle on or over sidewalks. The Village ordinance prohibits any motor vehicle from standing, stopping or parking on or over a sidewalk.

Keeping your property maintained helps improve property values in your neighborhood.
