Electronics Recycling Reinstated For Now

Electronics have not been allowed in your regular garbage for several years now. At first the money collected from manufacturers paid for the recycling and villages also got a little back for their efforts. This was when the price paid for recyclable products was high. Now it is very low.

We are a member of the Solid Waste Agency of

Lake County (SWALCO). In fact our very own Trustee Larry Mount is the Chairman for the countywide agency. A vote by the SWALCO members on April 14 funded the electronic recycling through the end of 2016 with donations from its members, most notably Grayslake. Grayslake will also host the electronic recycling collection center. Thank you Grayslake for your

leadership on this issue. You can take your electronics for recycling to their facility off Route 83 at the public works department. Monday - Friday, 7:00 am - 3:30 pm, Saturday 8:00 am - noon.

2016 Capital Improvement Plans Announced

The goal of the annual Capital Plan is to maintain the Village's critical infrastructure. The Village moved its capital plan one year earlier to address capital needs while maintaining annual debt service. In addition to the \$5 million bond, the Village Engineer and staff applied for a \$2.0 million low interest loan through the IEPA Drinking Water State Revolving Funds.

The accelerated Road Program for 2016 will include about 13 centerline miles of streets and over 1.3 miles of new water main. For more information about these projects, visit the Village's website: www.villageofroundlakebeach.com/367/Road-Construction-Updates.

New Police Officer Spring is here

Jon Cwynar graduated from the basic recruit academy at the Police Training Institute in Champaign on March 31. Officer Cwynar immediately started the Field Training Program with the police department.



With Spring here, many people enjoy taking walks. Please do not park your vehicle on or over sidewalks. The Village ordinance prohibits any motor vehicle from standing, stopping or parking on or over a sidewalk. A violation of this ordinance could result in a \$40 fine.

People also enjoy opening their windows for fresh

air. Please remember that not everyone wants to hear your loud music. The Village has two ordinances that deal with music.

1. *The playing of any radio, stereo, computer or musical instrument or device in such a manner or with such volume, between the hours of 9:00 pm and 7:00 am, so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of any person in any residence, office, dwelling, business, public place, or any person*

in the vicinity is prohibited.

2. *The use or operation of a loudspeaker or sound amplification device in connection with any radio, tape recorder, stereo, computer, microphone, or other devices in which the emanated sounds are of such a strength, character, intensity, or duration so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of any person in any residence, office, dwelling, business, public place, or any person in the vicinity is prohibited.*

Stormwater management

Homeowners are challenged with how to manage storm water on their property. Here are a few tips to address standing water problems. Consider simple remedies like relocating your downspouts and sump pump discharge to reduce the volume of water flowing to the low spot. Be open to Best Management Practices like rain barrels, rain gardens and permeable pavers. Rain gardens use specific plants and soils that absorb large amounts of rainwater.

Healthy Household Habits for Clean Water

- Recycle used oil and other automotive fluids at participating service stations. Don't dump these chemicals down the storm drain or dispose of them in your trash.
- Use a commercial car wash or wash your car on a lawn or other unpaved surface to minimize the amount of dirty soapy water flowing into the storm drain and eventually into your local water body.
- Check your car, boat, motorcycle and other machinery and equipment for leaks and spills. Make repairs as soon as possible. Clean up spilled fluids with an absorbent material like kitty litter or sand and don't rinse the spills into a nearby storm drain. Remember to properly dispose of absorbent material.

Brush Pick Up

The Village picks up tree limbs/debris only after a storm. Please make sure that the butt end of the limb is facing the street – this will make it easier for our crew to pick up.

Free Wood Chips

Wood chips are available for pick-up by Round Lake Beach residents at the Public Works facility (911 Lotus Dive – east side of building).

Long Grass and Weeds

The village has an ordinance prohibiting grass and weeds in excess of 8 inches. Failure to cut your grass and weeds could result in a \$40 fine and if you still fail to cut the grass the village will cut the grass with the costs being the responsibility of the owner.

Property Maintenance Code 302.4 details can be found on the Village website.

Trash Receptacles

The village also has an ordinance that requires businesses and homes to have proper trash receptacles and for those receptacles to be stored in the rear of their premises. The village also prohibits trash receptacles from being left at the curb or ditch line in excess of 24 hours either before or after pick up. Violations can result in a \$40 fine.
