Kathy Foley, Officers Sandy Molidor and Deb Lundgren will retire from



## Sun, Summer and Mosquitoes

Almost 100 acres will be treated by hand, backpack and helicopter within the Village this summer to reduce nuisance mosquito populations and prevent the spread of West Nile Virus. Over 2,000 street side catch basins will be treated by technicians on bicycles in June/July to help reducing mosquito breeding in the underground water systems.

Four adult mosquito control treatments will be performed during the season to kill adult mosquitoes. These treatments are performed based on adult mosquito surveillance in the area and are not prescheduled. If you would like to be notified prior to spraying, please contact the Mosquito Hotline at (800) 942-2555 and asked to be placed on the "Prior Notification" list for the Village.

Homeowners are encouraged to report stagnant water (3 days or more) on their property to the same Mosquito Hotline. Empty water from flower pots, kiddie swimming pools, pet food/water dishes, birdbaths and swimming pool covers at least once or twice a week.

## Yard Waste/Leaf Pickup

Yard Waste stickers can be purchased for \$2.65 each at the Round Lake Beach Village Hall (1937 Municipal Way), Jewel Food Store (900 E. Rollins Road) and Ace Hardware (659 Railroad Avenue).

You may dispose of leaves and other yard waste in brown paper yard waste bags or in 32-gallon cans marked yard waste with yard waste stickers on them. Residents may put up six bags or six 32-gallon cans out per week. If you already subscribe to the yard waste program you do not need a yard waste sticker.

# Saving Our Shoreline, Naturally

This summer the Round Lake Management Commission will benefit the community of people of Round Lake Area as well as the community of organisms calling the waters home. With the help of ILM, a regional ecological services firm providing the RLMC with permitting and native plant installation, the vision of Round Lake Shoreline Stabilization Project will be seen soon.

Such a project will ensure the stabilization of roughly 400 feet of shoreline at Lakefront Park in Round Lake Beach. Two stages are planned to take place over the course of 12 to 18 months. The first portion consists of vegetated geogrids which are intermitted with live stakes of native plant species to stabilize the shoreline. Some of these include Shadbush Serviceberry and Silky Dogwood.

The second stage involves installing coconut fiber rolls to serve as breakwaters along the shoreline. This portion will help restore a natural shoreline allowing for little erosion, if at all. Here too, native vegetation will be planted, such as Common Bur-Reed, Marsh Milkweed, and Dense Blazing Star which supports bountiful blooms and food sources for pollinators like the Monarch Butterfly, an icon for wildlife conservation.

Adding that to the Lake County Watershed Development Ordinance report of Round Lake as a High Quality Aquatic Resource, these equal to positive impacts, and something residences of the area and within the watershed should continue to keep up. With this stabilization and restoration project undertaken, it will not only provide habitat for many local species, but also demonstrate how private land owners may also support such ecological and sustainable practices for Round Lake.
