When Luis Miranda Jr. heard his father calling for help, he quickly dialed 911. His grandmother, Maria Miranda, was exhibiting

signs of distress and Luis' quick thinking helped save her.

Also to be commended for quick, calm and decisive actions was Officer Ken Lupi. He performed CPR on Mrs. Miranda until the emergency personnel arrived.

"Their actions certainly contributed to the woman's survival," said Chief Bitler. "Luis Miranda, Jr. calmly explained the problem to 911 dispatchers and met the emergency personnel and led them to his grandmother. Officer Lupi responded promptly and professionally."

From the Department of Public Works

Sun, summer and mosquitoes

The Village's mosquito control program began in late May with inspections and treatment of breeding sites-retention ponds, drainage ditches, wetlands or low areas that tend to hold water. Inspections will continue through early September. Almost 100 acres will be treated by hand, backpack and helicopter within the Village this summer to reduce nuisance mosquito populations and prevent the spread of West Nile Virus. In addition, street side catch basins will be treated by technicians on bicycles in June and July to help reduce mosquito breeding in the underground water system.

Four adult mosquito control treatments will be performed during the season to kill adult mosquitoes "on the wing". These treatments are based on adult mosquito surveillance in the area and are not prescheduled. If you would like to be notified prior to spraying, please call the Mosquito Hotline at (800) 942-2555 and ask to be placed on the Prior Notification List for the Village of Round Lake Beach. Homeowners are also encouraged to report stagnant water (3 days or more) on their property this summer to the same Mosquito Hotline.

Waste Management rate increase

As per our contract with Waste Management an increase of 5% for all refuse, recycling and landscape waste removal will be effective on July 1, 2011.
