## From the Round Lake Beach Police Department

### Inaugural Shop with Cop program

Round Lake Beach Police announced their inaugural Shop with a Cop Program which benefits Village children who will otherwise not have a happy Christmas. RLB Police Officers will be escorting up to 40 children to the Round Lake Beach Wal-Mart for a \$100 shopping spree.

Officers will make sure children purchase necessary items (coats, boots, etc.) In addition, every child will be required to purchase at least one toy for themselves.

### Lakefront Security

Once again the Lakefront Beach Park is open to the public and visitors will see Security Guards patrolling the park until it closes at dusk. These part-time guards are college students

who have chosen Law Enforcement as a career.

The Security Guards will be in easy-to-identify polo shirts and will be ready to give directions, aid, or advice if needed. They are equipped with police radios to call a police unit or ambulance if needed and will work seven days per week.

Also, the Round Lake Management Commission has asked the Round Lake Beach Police Department to patrol the lake again. Each weekend at different times you will see the Round Lake Management Commission boat on the water manned by a police officer, whose job is to educate and promote safety through inspections and enforcement.

## From the Department of Public Works

### Mosquito abatement begins

The Village's mosquito control program began in late May with inspection and treatment of breeding sites-retention ponds, drainage ditches, wetlands or low areas that tend to hold water-and inspections will continue through early September. Almost 100 acres will be treated by hand, backpack and helicopter within the Village this summer to reduce nuisance mosquito populations and prevent the spread of West Nile Virus. In addition, street side catch basins will be treated in June and July by technicians on bicycles to help reduce mosquito breeding in the underground water system.

Four adult mosquito control treatments will be performed during the season to kill adult mosquitoes "on the wing". Adult mosquito control is performed based on adult mosquito surveillance in the area and are not prescheduled. If you would like to be notified prior to spraying, please contact the "Mosquito Hotline" at (800) 942-2555 and asked to be placed on the Prior Notification List for the Village.

### Meter inspection before moving

Before an occupancy permit can be scheduled, a final water meter inspection has to be done by the Public Works Department. This should be done three weeks prior to moving.

### Summer street repairs underway

The Village of Round Lake Beach has begun repairs on a number of streets this summer. Repairs are expected to be completed by the end of the year. Construction includes curbs, gutters, sidewalks, new storm sewers and replacement of water mains. Streets involved include :

- West End from Clarendon to Wildwood
- Wildwood from East End to West End
- Shorewood from Hainesville to East End
- Round Lake from West End to park entrance


